


Very Interesting Stuff

I watched a great documentary on TV recently, it was about the largest super aircraft carrier in the world it was the USS Ronald Reagan they commenced building it in 1998 and it took 5 years to build at a cost of 4.5 billion dollars and was launched by Nancy Reagan.

It is powered by two nuclear reactors that will run for 20 years before needing replacement and has two 30 ton anchors and houses about 60 jet fighters under the deck and is the home of 5000 to 6000 sailors and will serve the country for the next 50 years. The F-18 Hornets—jet fighter cost 54 million dollars each and yes the most outstanding thing about this super aircraft carrier is that its identification number is **76** and it is the large number displayed on the bridge.
