

The aircraft display was phenomenal with the RAAF bringing a Hercules Bomber, the Red Baron, the Roulettes with their incredible acrobatic manoeuvres were really spectacular, the model aeroplanes were fantastic and displays by the Navy and Army had the kids queueing up to get a closer look inside.





We were able to inspect the huge RAAF Hercules Bommer, the size of this aircraft was unbelievable.

I was very impressed by the Catalina, such a beautiful site it reminds me of a large prehistoric bird. The Red Baron was there and also the Red Bull stunt plane, also Dakota's and many other historic aircraft.

In the large hanger there was many food stalls, amusements, NSW fire brigade display, ambulance display, police recruiting, vintage machinery, RAAF simulators, aircraft painting and drawing, model plane and car stalls.

Well after wearing ourselves out trekking around the air strip we met up with Kay who had finished her work and all had our lunch together beside our cars.

After lunch at about 2:00pm we decided to leave. As I was driving out, the 5 or 6 Roulettes did a magnificent fly over. It was great to arrive back in Sydney at about 3:30pm after another enjoyable day.
