




EDITORIAL





Country P76 outing to Grenfell Henry Lawson festival long weekend in June.



Interesting to look at the early months of production, where Leyland completely
underestimated the demand for the upper range models. They stockpiled a lot of
Deluxe for the june 26 th launch thinking that this was going to be the model most in
demand. As it turned out a lot of the initial demand was for the V8 Super's and
Executives.
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I have spoken to a number of old Leyland dealers who were losing sales to Holden and Ford simply because customers were not prepared to wait for car to turn up. By the time Leyland ramped up production of the upper range models and caught up with demand in early 1974 the horse had already bolted.
