






On the left we have my car, Tony Deluca's Executive & Joe Green's Force 7V at the carpark at Berrima during their display day/rally.

### MARCH/APRIL 2007

Hi again everyone!

It's been a pretty busy couple of months for me & the Hairy Lime car. Seems nearly every weekend we were going somewhere! It started off in February, with a run to Jugiong to spend a day with the ACT & Country Club at the Cootumundra Historic Vehicle club birthday run. Next was a weekend at Berrima with the Berrima District historic vehicle club & a few guys from the Classic club. Next was a Sunday on the lawns in front of old Parliament House with the ACT P76 club for the Wheels 2007 Expo. Next was a drive to Pit Town for the "Oakville Fire Brigade's Family Day". Finally we had a run to "The Rocks" in Sydney where the Historic Houses Trust had a display day called "Livin in the 70's" where the Executive was on display.

The big rig has done nearly 6,500 km's since I put it on the road in December & it has mostly been trouble free. A couple of minor oil leaks have sprung up, the Central Locking on the rear doors doesn't always work & a minor tail shaft vibration is evident at high speeds on the expressway. All in all, though it's been going pretty well. The integrated air conditioning is Fabulous, works really well, in fact the whole car drives excellently. It is such a smooth, quiet easy car to drive. The clutch, steering, brakes are light, in fact all the controls are light & easy to use, the whole impression is of a much smaller car to drive. When you take on such a big project & alter stuff from standard, you run the risk of losing the "character" of the car, trying to make it something it was never meant to be & in my view, destroying the car in the process & I was really concerned about this. But I must say that this is the Best P76 I have driven. It's smooth, quiet & comfortable, but it now makes my white Super look a bit 2nd hand.... More work needed there now, but I suppose it's lifting the standard of my fleet! A pleasant surprise is how economical it is. Again, much better than my white Super. I haven't fixed the calibration of the speedo yet (The 5 speed box has made the speedo read 10% slow), so I can't give you comparative figures, but I have rello's down the South coast, & on the way back the Super will need a refill about Pennant Hills, but the Executive will get all the way home & still have some left... Impressive. It will be interesting to compare all three cars on the trip to the Geelong Nationals next year ( Presuming the Taxi will be finished by Next Easter) . That will give me a true comparative result.

Speaking of The Geelong Nationals... it's looking like it will be a great time. I just emailed Ken Western (The main man in Vic) & the total so far, is 34 Cabins & 8 campsites booked, 101 people & 44 cars so far, I reckon that's a pretty good start with there being still a year to go. This set of numbers doesn't include people who intend on coming but don't require accommodation.... I would think a lot of the Vic club members would fit into this catagory, plus there will always be the people who want to book their own accommodation or have yet to decide... So check out the details elsewhere in this magazine & "Get a Move On!" The more people coming the better it will be! Now, back to the Taxi... The poor old thing has finally made it inside the workshop, so I suppose you could say I finally have started on it. Another mechanic friend of mine bought an old 2 post hoist to put in his shed at home..... Problem is he doesn't have a shed at home yet... so he has kindly loaned it to me. I had a good look at the rusty chassis rail....Shit it looks horrible, so this hoist will be just the thing to allow me to cut it out & make up a new one ...without the pressure of having to have a hoist free for paying customers. I bought an old video recorder off the bloke next door, with the plan of making a DVD of the Taxi project from go to Whoa...As well as the trip to Geelong for the National meeting. So you see I have my work cut out for me & there is no excuse for you guys to not get your finger out, get your car ready & come along too! You only get out of this P76 movement what you put into it..... So let's get going!

Our club was invited to participate in the Car Display in support of the Oakville Fire Brigade Family Day. This day which is now in its second year pulled in over 100 cars, trucks, buses, bikes and even stationary engines to help raise money for the volunteer bush fire brigade. Jason Birmingham and his stunning Hairy Lime Exec, Shannon Wharton and his very original and tidy Valiant VK Ranger wagon represented our club and myself with my daughters KE70 Corolla tarmac rally car. Sadly only one P76 but I'm sure that every one of the big crowd in attendance checked out Jason's green meanie. The club banner was on display letting everyone know of our presence. Apart from doing our bit for P76 promotion, we had a very interesting chat with a gentleman who has a stock of NOS P76 and other Leyland/BMC parts, which the club is going to look into buying. Could be quite a score. More info on this as details come to light.

There was quite a varied and eclectic bunch of vehicles on display. A superbly restored HZ Holden Premier looked like it had just been driven off the showroom floor, as did many other lovingly restored cars. Of great interest was the 1974 Ford LTD wagon, which was imported from the USA by Wood Coffil Funerals and converted into a hearse. Originally this car was one of 180 cars especially for the US Dring Squad. The cops took delivery of 178, which left 2 to be sold off one of which came here. This car was custom built for the Drug Squad and included RSJ steel beams welded in behind the front and rear bumpers so it could ram through gates etc. when busting drug runners without disabling the car. The only way you could tell it was different to a standard LTD was that the bumpers sat about 4 to 6 inches further out than stock. Of course there was a fair selection of vintage and veteran cars and trucks on display as well as some great classics, interesting kit cars, exciting race cars, familiar old buses and very old stationary engines.


The kit cars included the usual selection of hotrods with an unusual harlequin painted Cobra. Some of the great classics included a Ferrari 365 GT4 2+2, a couple of E Type Jags, convertible and hardtop. The Sydney Off Road Racing Association had a large display of Off Road Race cars from various classes, a nice 73 VW bug and my daughters Corolla represented the Classic Rally Club and there was also a very interesting rail dragster. 
**Drug Squad Wagon**

#### Dear P76 Owners and Families

Well we are underway with the planning for the 2008 P76 Nationals to be held in Victoria at Easter in 2008, over the long weekend starting on Good Friday 21 March 2008 and finishing on Monday 24 March 2008. We are putting together what we think will be an interesting program of events of which we will forward more information as we get closer and the details are finalized. This letter is to advise you and your club members of one of the most important issues - the accommodation. Our committee has decided that the 2008 Nationals will be staged in Geelong, the 2d largest city outside of Melbourne. Geelong is about a 90-minute drive from Melbourne, and one of the oldest cities in Victoria. It is a major port, the home of Ford manufacturing, and has some interesting tourist centres. It is not far from the Great Ocean Road or from Ballarat - both major tourist attractions.

One of the objectives set by our committee is to maximize the exposure of our great car to the general public. We have been doing this within our club with great results - our membership is increasing and the standard of our cars is steadily improving. We want to continue this proc-

ess of public exposure at our National get together. So Geelong makes a good choice we believe.

On behalf of all the clubs, our club has made a booking for a number of cabins in a campground in Geelong called the "Riverglen Holiday Park". It is a good quality campground on the outskirts of Geelong, and close to shops and other accommodation should members wish to stay elsewhere. I have enclosed a couple of brochures for your committee to see. The cost for one of the cabins we have booked is \$90 per night with a minimum of 4 nights over the Easter period - this can be the Thursday to the Sunday nights; or Friday through Monday nights. This price is consistent with most campgrounds in Victoria over the Easter period as is the 4-day minimum booking. These are luxury cabins and will sleep six. The \$90 is for two people, with extras costing \$10 each per night.

We will need to finalise and confirm the bookings as early as possible as accommodation is at a premium over Easter. We also have to pay a deposit when confirming.. Should members wish to arrange their own accommodation that is fine, but we do suggest they get in quickly, no matter where they want to stay. ff members want to stay in the Riverglen, but want to camp - again let us know as we can add it to the bookings we have made. A \$50 deposit will also be required for these campgrounds. Cost of a powered campsite is \$29 per day again with a minimum of 4 days. We need to confirm our arrangements at Riverglen by no later than Easter this year, so we would require anyone who wants to stay at the Riverglen to send us a \$50 deposit before then - no later than 25 March 2007.

One of the benefits of all staying at the one venue will be that the P76 talking and comparing cars can go on till late over a few beers without worrying about Booze Buses!! Riverglen will be the Nationals Headquarters, and all of our committee will be staying there. There are large parks opposite the campground with some good children's play equipment. We want to encourage family participation, and there is plenty for the family to do in Geelong.
