From the Registrars desk

Since our last magazine in July, we have helped several of our members to register and/or re - register their vehicles in both HVS and CVS schemes. In late July/early August we were advised via the CMC, that Service NSW had announced, due to the extra workload from Covid related duties, they would not be able to offer some of the more 'non - essential' tasks they would normally do over the counter. Included in this announcement was Historic and Classic vehicle registration which they consider to be recreational and not essential. Fortunately, they also advised that the normal expiry period associated with both pink and blue slips would be waived so that people wouldn't have to get them re - issued once things get back to normal.

Fortunately, the majority of our members that have needed these services, were based outside of greater Sydney which meant they had access to Service NSW offices to facilitate this. We have had at least one member who had to try a second Service NSW outlet within Sydney, after being turned away from the first, but was able to finalise his registration at the second attempt. Feedback from the motoring community confirms that it really does change depending on which office you attend and how busy they are.

Changes to CVS Registration.

We have just been advised by CMC that they have finally been accredited as an approved organisation. This was something they were seeking as part of the splitting of responsibilities from ACMC, which as the only body approved to deal with CVS registrations, had become overwhelmed by the shear numbers of vehicles involved.

The requirements for CVS registration remain unchanged, in terms of paperwork however the processing fee will need to be paid into a different (CMC) account - you can pay the \$25.00 fee by cheque or money order made payable to CMC CVS, or you can EFT the funds to



Parts Department

P76 Front Strut Inserts.

Having properly working front suspension is critical to the performance and safety of any car however in the case of the P76 the hydraulic inserts for the Front Struts, is now a part which is no longer available over the counter from any of the suppliers of suspension parts. Because of this the club organised the re - manufacture of these critical components and have had them remade on two occasions now, the last being in 2016. To organise this purchase the club has to commit to a minimum of 50 sets (pairs), so it's not something we can do on a regular basis or at short notice.

As stock from the previous order is now pretty well exhausted, we need to see if there is enough interest to justify another production run. Consequently, we need to see if we can get a Strut order together. Prices for the struts will be approx. \$350/pair although as we are buying in US dollars we won't know exactly what the final price will be until we place the order and pay the supplier.

To be able to make this work we will be offering to discount the above price, to approx. \$332.50/pair for those interested in placing an order and paying for them upfront. Of course there may need to be an adjustment - a small refund or shortfall to be paid depending on the exchange variation. The prices above is based on the struts being collected at a club meeting, so if freight is required to deliver your order this will need to be added and paid prior to delivery.

Lead time will be confirmed after we have placed the order but we would expect approx 8 - 12 weeks following order placement. We need to get numbers in ASAP as this order will also be coordinated with the other P76 clubs nationally. So, if you require struts either now or in the foreseeable future (bearing in mind that worn out struts can affect registration as well as drivability) we would encourage you to order now as it could be another 5 - 6 years before we need to order these again.



DR PHILTHY'S (and friends) TECH TIPS – Some of these might be re-issues of Phil's old Tech Tips but are being reproduced for the benefit of our newer Club Members.

P76 TIE BAR RUBBERS

This month's Tech Tip is about P76 Tie Bar Rubbers, which are very important little critters, given the job they do. The tie bar has gone by many names, depending on manufacturer and which way the wind was blowing. Radius rods, trailing arms/rods and castor rods are among a few you may have heard in your travels. The tie bar on a P76 serves to keep the control arm and front strut positioned correctly and accurately located within the wheel arch. This a critical job as a P76's road-holding capability depends on all its wheel alignment angles being correct and within specifications. As you know both the strut and the control arm must move, so the tie bar must as well. This is where the rubbers come in.

Before we offer you a few helpful hints about how to make the job of changing tie bar rubbers a bit easier, let's have a look at the various components which are needed to enable a tie bar to do its job properly:



A P76 tie bar is a long partially threaded bar with a “fork” welded at the other (front) end. On the threaded end you will find two rubber bushes (two halves), sandwiched between a set of washers and nuts. Going from front to rear, there is the front adjustment nut which is then followed by a large cupped or concave washer. This normally presses (when tightened properly) against the front (male) rubber (bush) which has a large outside diameter at the front end and a smaller diameter at its rear. This male bush passes through a hole or aperture in the half-chassis when fitted on the car. On the other (rear) side of the aperture the female side of the bush is fitted, which is held against the rear face of the chassis aperture by a large diameter flat washer and the rear adjustment nut. There is also an “R” clip, which is meant to be fitted, to prevent the rear nut coming off but don't be surprised if you find a cut down adjustment nut has been fitted as a lock nut instead for the same purpose.

To protect the threaded section of the tie bar and help to stop the tie bar rubbers from being over tightened (which can greatly shorten the life of the rubbers), there is a precision length steel tube (a crush tube) located between the front and rear steel washers, which limits the travel of the adjustment nuts. This tube passes through the inside diameter of the two tie bar rubber halves thus limiting the “crush” of the bush. Initially during the car's production, these crush tubes were 2” long but as this length led to the rubbers prematurely failing in service, Leyland issued a technical bulletin (update), Service Bulletin C 1/75 as published by Leyland on 28/01/1975, which advised adding a sleeve to increase the length of the crush tube to a length of 2¼”

The job of replacing the tie bar rubbers is made easier if the vehicle is run up onto a set of car-ramps to allow easier and greater access to the area. Before undoing anything, measure the distance from the forward edge of the front nut, on the bush assembly, to the centre of the bolt that secures the front fork of the tie bar to the control arm. This dimension is usually about 270mm or roughly 11” but it may vary, depending on whether or what the castor was adjusted to during the car's last wheel alignment. Write down the measurement so once you have refitted everything you can tighten the bush up to roughly the same position, which saves a great deal of time when the wheel alignment is next done.

From here, the Leyland Workshop Manual describes the dismantling and reassembly procedure for fitting new rubbers, so we don't need to cover that ground again. The main points to remember are, to ensure that the new rubbers are adequately compressed by ensuring both the front and rear nuts are tightened firmly against the steel crush tube and don't forget to refit the R clip or lock nut to prevent the rear nut from going on “walk-a-bout” if it does somehow manage to work itself loose.

Lastly, have your car's wheel alignment checked by a competent workshop (tape measures are only so accurate) after doing any work on its front suspension.




