Ron Butler and the ongoing development of his P76

Ever since I had my engine reconditioned, I have been reading up on engine breathing i.e. getting cold air to the induction manifold. Modern cars have a breather in the grille going through a filter to the induction port.

When I had the engine done I fitted a Willpower inlet manifold made for the P76. I wanted a 500 CFM electric choke carburettor that required a 20mm bakelite spacer so that the air filter would clear the electric choke. The height of the air filter was 60 mm. I couldn't close the bonnet as it was touching the front of the filter lid so I inverted my belt sander and sanded the bakelite spacer down to 10mm in the front back to 20mm at the rear so the air filter was on the same slope as the bonnet it also cleared the electric choke.

The combination of these aftermarket parts worked very well, and the engine pulled like a train. But I was always conscious of the heat build-up as naturally aspirated engines are required to breathe freely. So back to the computer. I found something called heat soak. Basically, it's the heat of the engine transmitted through the inlet manifold to the carburettor causing mild evaporation of petrol in the carburettor. To prevent this you can buy a Phenolic spacer that fits between the inlet manifold and the carburettor. They come in all sizes 50mm to 8mm which I bought as I had no room for anything larger. That didn't help the fresh air problem, so I bought a cheap and nasty air filter and flexible 75mm hose. It also came with a little turbofan 63 mm od, so I drilled a 63mm hole in the spacer panel between the radiator and the body and fitted the fan which also came with a couple of adaptors to fit the flexible hose pipe so took the pipe from the fan up to near the air filter held on with cable ties. It looked bloody horrible but I wanted to see if it made any difference. so taking it on the motorway up to Waikanae at the speed limit to warm it up and to check no cops on the way back I planted boot.


What a hell of a difference, it was a massive boost in acceleration. It felt like someone had switched another engine on. Back in the garage I removed it all, replacing the spacer panel with the original one as I wanted time to figure this one out. The problem was "how to get fresh air from the turbo fan in the spacer panel to near the air filter without upsetting the bling of the engine. I didn't want to alter the body in any way. It had to look as new original and to be returned to original by just unbolting.


Then one day scratching my head and picking my nose it hit me "The bloody Bonnet" Seeing the air filter is up close to the bonnet all I had to do was fix up a duct under the bonnet. So back on goes the spacer panel and fan, bought a silicon $150 \times 150 \times 63$ mm id bend, chop 40mm off it, place a piece of gauze over the back of the fan, shove the silicon pipe onto the back of the fan drill through the top of the pipe into the fan body for a self-tapping screw to hold and locate in the future. Made up a cardboard model of the duct, tried it out for size, took it to the local aluminium fabricators and they made it perfectly. Another positive thing is that it will be more economical.

It has worked for me and should work for you too, good luck.
