Dear Darren & Alissa,

In answer to your email, and in response to my conversation with Darren on Sunday, I enclose the following.

Farrell Flat is 20 km from both Clare and Burra, 13 km from Mintaro, we are about 2 hours drive from central Adelaide.

We have parking for at least 5 cars on site, and could fit more along the driveway. We also have plenty of on street parking, and a car park in the median strip in front of our premises. Farrell Flat is a very quiet country town; so on street parking is not an issue.

Activities; we can offer a guided or self guided walk around Farrell Flat, the town was on the copper ore road from Burra to Pt. Wakefield, in the 1800's, as well it was a major rail shipment for grain from the mid-north, on the Broken Hill line. There are a number of significant historic buildings worth seeing.

We also have the option of a shed tour of our car collection and assorted sundries, in the 1860's blacksmith and wheelwright shop.

If members are slightly active a short dirt road trip, and a walk will reveal a marvelous sheep fold from the 1840's just out of the town.

Tours of Martindale Hall, Mintaro Maze, and Timandra Gardens in Mintaro are a 10 minute drive away. The historic town of Burra is a 20 minute drive and offers self guided tours of the historic mining town, which could well fill most of a day on its own. We are also only 20-30 minutes to a range of excellent wineries in the Clare and Polish Hill valleys.

For meals we can offer a range of possibilities;

- 1. From our Café we offer fresh baked pies, quiches, breads and cakes, with a range of condiments.
- 2. If you wish for a more formal Christmas dinner for your members, roast dinner (turkey, pork) with vegetables and salads, fresh hot rolls, followed by a Christmas pudding or a cheesecake.
- 3. Alternatively, a buffet meal with a selection of meats, salads, vegetables, breads, followed by an apple pie or Christmas pudding.

All options would include tea and plunger coffee.

Cost for each option is \$20 per head.

The call came in; there were P parts to be had, and no time to waste! General Kneebone rallied his troops for an operational briefing. 
We hope all comers will use this event as an opportunity to get those parts you need or perhaps off load those parts you don't need.
