

There will be over 1,000 cars on display, including (hopefully) a couple of P76's. A \$20 entry fee will be charged upon entry. P76 Alpine Tour

Friday 25 to Sunday 27 April, 2008

This will be a touring assembly with no serious navigation required although you will be given a map of the tour after booking. It is anticipated to focus on the beauty of this part of Victoria as it slowly transforms itself in preparation for winter. While we are hoping for mild weather, being the Australian Alps, the weather is more unpredictable in this part of Australia than nearly any other. Hence we may get 30degree days or we may have snow or both. Either way, your P76 should be in sound mechanical condition, your club will have with it some tools to carry out basic repairs. I'm anticipating we will have about six couples for the trip if we get more that will be great, but I need to be realistic. The roads are all top quality roads and all sealed.



At this stage accommodation will be at Harrietville and Omeo. Costs will be contained and there will be the option to camp at Harrietville if that's what takes your fancy.

Friday 25th April

At this stage the meeting point will be the ANZAC memorial at Wangaratta on Friday Morning 11 am. After a club wreath is laid we will then move on to visit some wineries as we work our way up the Owens Valley stopping at Bright on the way. We will then head out to Harrietville or Bright and settle in early to allow people to have some time to walk and enjoy the area. Dinner will be at the Harrietville Pub which will probably have some live music.

Saturday 26th

This will test the cars and crew as we head up onto Mount Hotham and take in the mountain air and views, a brief stop at Hotham village and then on to Dinner Plain. Lunch will be where ever you want to get it today.

On leaving the village we will head toward Omeo passing the Hotham Airport and with brief viewing stop to look across the mountains toward Mt Kosciusko. Into Omeo, another quick stop at the Chinese diggings on the outside of town then we stop for the night at Omeo. Here you have a choice of accommodation, the Pub with deluxe suite for \$100 per couple per night or the school camp for \$40 per couple, your choice please indicate on the form. Dinner will be a BBQ dinner at the school camp and may involve some of the locals coming to have look see.



Sunday 27th

Sorry but it already time to go home but not before you travel on some of the best driving roads in Australia. From Omeo to Swift's Creek and then on to Bruthen before heading to Bairnsdale and home. On the way we will stop at the Ensay Winery and then lunch at Bruthen Bakery.

Into Bairnsdale where we will briefly assemble outside the water tower for photos. Unfortunately from here you head straight down the highway to Melbourne arriving home soon after tea fortunately the Pakenham bypass will speed your trip home.



When you book for this weekend I will send you a tax invoice based on your options. This will require a 50% deposit which will be sent to the accommodation places with the balance paid by you directly on arrival. I will send you a map of the Area with sites to see as well as a pack containing points of interest. If you feel there is something you would particularly like to do or see on this journey let me know. Unfortunately we are unable to provide a petrol discount system as there is no consistent branded supplier for the whole journey

Dash Wood Grain Part 2

All that's left now is the instrument cluster. I tried using a 'low tack' spray mask vinyl to make a template, that ended up somewhere near the other pieces of screwed up vinyl. It was time to rethink...

I thought about using the damaged original vinyl from my spare housing as a template to cut the replacement from, but then thought some more and decided that would be too hard to align, and too hard to replicate where some pieces were missing...

With plenty of the new woodgrain at hand, I had a brainwave and made a start. I cleared some more room on the bench, adjusted my swivel chair, a fresh end on my knife, and a strong coffee I began experimenting with success.

With the instrument cluster devoid of all its original material and its aftermarket adhesives, I cut a piece of vinyl that completely covered it, allowing an overlap on all sides. Starting at the top of the cluster I began to stick the full sheet of woodgrain to it, working it down over the entire housing ensuring that it was well stuck to the edges of the instrument openings and warning lights, time to make the first incision. With blade in hand I made the first cut around a warning light, stopping part way through the cut on a few occasions to re-position the housing, ensuring the blade followed the outer edge of the lip, until I had gone all around it, then using the corner of my blade I lifted the cut-out piece off the top, pressed the woodgrain firmly down around the lip and moved to the next. The remainder of the housing was done the same way, snapping the blade to a fresh one as soon as it started to show the slightest sign of dragging. With all the cuts done on the housing all I needed to do was trim up the edges, sides first then top and bottom, put the gauges back in and re-install into the car.






And the award goes to.....
